Job Summary:

Jewish Family Services of Silicon Valley (JFS) seeks a compassionate and dedicated **Clinical Program Coordinator** to join our team. This role involves facilitating support groups and providing individual counseling services to older adults, caregivers, and other diverse populations, including the Jewish and LGBTQ+ communities. The **Clinical Program Coordinator** will also help expand the organization's mental health services to address unmet community needs. The successful candidate will demonstrate cultural sensitivity and competence in working with the Jewish community and the broader diverse populations JFS serves. All services must be delivered in compliance with legal, ethical, and professional standards, including the NASW Code of Ethics and HIPAA requirements.

Key Responsibilities:

Clinical Services:

- Conduct individual counseling sessions for older adults, caregivers, and individuals from diverse
 populations, including the Jewish community, LGBTQ+ clients, recent immigrants, and other
 underserved groups.
- Develop and lead support groups tailored to the needs of specific communities, such as caregivers, aging individuals, and marginalized populations.
- Assess clients' needs and implement personalized treatment plans that reflect sensitivity to cultural and religious values and practices.
- Maintain accurate and timely documentation of client interactions in compliance with organizational, legal, and ethical standards.

Compliance and Ethics:

- Abide by the National Association of Social Workers (NASW) Code of Ethics, ensuring all practices reflect the highest standards of professional integrity, client care, and social justice.
- Adhere to all legal and ethical standards, including HIPAA regulations, to safeguard client confidentiality.

- Implement and follow protocols for secure handling of sensitive information, including storage and transmission of records.
- Regularly review and update practices to ensure compliance with local, state, and federal regulations.

Record Keeping:

- Provide mentorship and support to interns or new team members, if applicable.

Qualifications

- **Education:** Master's degree in social work (MSW) from an accredited institution or master's degree in psychology/counseling.
- License: Current LCSW or LMFT licensure in California.
- Experience:
 - Minimum of 2 years of clinical experience, preferably with older adults, caregivers, and culturally diverse populations
 - Experience in group facilitation and community outreach is highly desirable.
- Skills:
 - Strong interpersonal and communication skills.
 - Knowledge of HIPAA compliance and federal/state laws related to privacy and data protection.
 - Ability to handle sensitive situations with professionalism and empathy.
 - Cultural competence and sensitivity to the needs of the Jewish community and other diverse populations.

 - Strong understanding of professional ethics as outlined in the NASW Code of Ethics and the ability to navigate complex confidentiality issues
